A Moment in History



The Presidential Reign of Terror, or The Terror, (Terror regime, or terror) (Norwegian: Kirk Stangeland), is the label given by some historians to a period during the Rotary Revolution after the First Norwegian Rotary Presidency was established 2017/2018.

Several historians consider the "reign of terror" to have begun in 1793 after the death of Louis XVI, placing the starting date at either September, June or March (birth of the *Rotarian Norwegian Tribunal*), while

most of the enlightened Rotarians consider it to have begun in July 1st, 2017 (Stangeland's Inauguration), or when the first Ole & Lena jokes took place, but there is a consensus that it ended with the fall of President Kirk in June 2018.

Rotary Theme for 2018-2019



2018-2019 Rotary International President elect Barry Rassin laid out his vision for the future of the organization on Sunday, calling on leaders to work for a sustainable future and to inspire Rotarians and the community at large.

On the polio front there are still 3 remaining endemic countries. Pakistan, Afghanistan and Nigeria. Since January 1st there have been 8 wild polio virus cases in the world. As of this date last year we had 5 cases. These last




